

The number of folks connecting to the Hallow app seems to be rapidly growing! A few folks share below about the app's content they are exploring and how it is impacting their faith journey.




"Here are three of the biggest reasons I love the Hallow app:

- 3. Amount of options within the app, from prayers to reflections to homilies, the opportunity to peacefully pray and be with God is in the palm of your hand."






