

Even though our stories were different, we all felt the same pain. We understood each other. Liz & Debbie did an amazing job guiding us through our journey. They are so kind, considerate, and caring. They listened to our stories and openly shared theirs. They created a calm, safe space to heal at our own pace. I thought the videos were helpful, too. As our sessions went on, some of our tears turned to laughter. Which felt great; it's okay to laugh.

I've come to understand that grief does not have a timeline. It's still okay to feel sad; it's still okay to cry. Taking that first step took a lot of strength and courage, but I'm so glad I did. I actually feel a little lighter. I feel validated." Lynne

Confirmation Level 1: Checking in, plus...

This faith year, our Confirmation Level 1 families are experiencing the *Pathways Mercy* resources **at home**, learning about the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. As part of the program, they also have four In-church sessions throughout the year to check in and complete a service project together that will benefit those in need in our community.

Earlier this month, the 45 families gathered for one of the four in-church sessions. They were invited to share in small groups about their experiences thus far working with the *Pathways Mercy* resources at home; they shared a funny moment, a challenging moment, and something they found meaningful about the journey to date. The session also explored the Spiritual Work of Mercy of **Comforting the Sick.**

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist and leaders in our Homebound Ministry, were our special guests. Jim provided a beautiful witness talk to the participants about what an EM is and why he is part of this ministry, relating some stories about his experiences with visiting Homebound members of our faith community. He brought several examples of a pyx, explaining that this is the round container used to carry the Eucharist to the homebound. He also brought a burse, a small pouch used to hold the pyx.



Following some Q&A with the families, the participants created one-decade rosaries, which will be distributed to the recipients of our Homebound visits. Several of our families took additional materials home to create more rosaries together for loved ones.



To close out the session, we prayed one decade of the rosary. It's our hope that this session will inspire more of our parents to join this special ministry.


