never had so many parents (and several siblings) go to Reconciliation during a First Reconciliation Service; in fact, the service went much longer than anticipated!"














Back in 1881, a 29-year-old Catholic priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, gathered a small group of men at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, CT, to organize a lay organization to unite Catholic men and provide for the families of deceased members. The patron became Christopher Columbus, and the Knights were incorporated on March 29, 1882.

Now, nearly 2 million men later, the Knights and their families around the globe have donated more than \$185 million to charity and performed more than 75 million hours of service under the KofC principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Fr. McGivney is currently being

canonized as a saint in the Catholic Church.









At the last meeting of the Elizabeth Ann Seton Council's meeting this year held on Thursday, December 21st, Brother Knights were asked to bring mostly bottles of wine, cordials, and liquor to raffle off after our A Team (cooking team) had cooked a roast beef dinner for our Brothers Knights. The purpose of the raffle is to raise money for both Notre Dame and Our Lady of Mercy parishes. The council matches what is raised and then presents a check to each Church. This year, \$1025 was raised and matched so that Notre Dame and Our Lady of Mercy received the above amount. Notre Dame's money will be dedicated to Project Appalachia. Our Lady of Mercy will use the funds for Caring and Sharing, which benefits those in need.

Listening to & Equipping Our Catechists for Mission

In mid-December, Vince Lunetta, from Pflaum Publishing, which produces the *Gospel Weeklies Visions* resources we now use in Confirmation formation, visited the parish to lead the catechists in prayer, reflection, and feedback about their experience so far this year using these materials. Vince initially visited us back in September to meet the Confirmation catechists and introduce them to the program.



During our time together, Vince emphasized the importance of sharing our own personal witness with others as disciples. Since many people lack the skills to tell their faith story confidently and cogently, providing a basic structure for storytelling could be helpful, and he gave us some basic suggestions on what to include in future sessions.



Guiding our teens in discovering their talents and charisms is also valuable, and Vince suggested the assessment <u>Clifton Strengths Explorer</u> as an optional tool for Faith Formation families. This is the child version of the adult counterpart Strengthsfinder and provides a certificate of the top three talents for each child taking the assessment. This could be offered as an option for parents who are interested in pursuing this on their own.

The Family Faith Formation team will take the next few weeks to discern what suggestions may work for the culture of our own families here at Notre Dame. Please continue to pray for our teens and their parents as they are formed in their faith.
