Pastoral Council Update

This past November, a renewed model for the Notre Dame of Mt. Carmel Pastoral Council was announced, with the purpose of -- in consultation with Fr. Paddy -- clearly articulating the vision, mission, and strategies that will guide our parish's health and growth as Missionary Disciples of Jesus Christ.

At that point, a nomination process was opened to the parish, whereby parishioners could nominate other parishioners (or themselves) to be considered for membership to the council. All nominees were asked to review the *Pastoral Council*Foundational Principles and, if they wished to be considered for membership, to complete an application for Pastoral Council Membership.

A total of 20 nominations were submitted, and 14 of the nominees accepted the nomination and completed the application. Last night, in the presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit, the existing council members began the discernment process.



The renewed council will be in place by mid-February. Please pray for the discernment process and for those who will ultimately be called to serve our community as part of this leadership body.

Fruitfulness in the Mission through Mentoring & Raising New Leaders!

In early August, a small group of "seasoned" women leaders and younger women visibly invested in their faith and families here at Notre Dame came together for a series of conversations regarding future opportunities to broaden the outreach to women in the community, especially those in younger generations.



The conversations led to the formation of the **Daughters of Grace Ministry**, which seeks to inspire, encourage, and disciple women of all ages by creating spaces for friendship, support, mentorship, service, and spiritual growth.

One of the opportunities set forth by the ministry has been the *Spa for the Soul* monthly gatherings, with the first series themed on *The Beatitudes*. From a strategic standpoint, the goal has been to nurture and mentor new leaders. As those younger voices also take the lead on these faith sessions, sharing their unique gifts, insights, and perspectives, the hope is that those prospective participants will see that these spaces make room for their younger life insights and experiences.

Mentoring, Accompanying, Rasing New Leaders: The Spa for the Soul series was started by seasoned leader **Beth Letizia**, who led sessions themed on the first two Beatitudes. Beth then guided and mentored one of the "newer" voices, **Amanda Mazzetta**, who led the most recent session on the Third Beatitude.

Fr. Michal Rybinski to Receive Knights of Columbus 4th Degree Sword


