I didn't know what a ministry serving children with Special Needs would look like, but I knew immediately that I wanted to be part of it. By degree, I am an Occupational Therapist. I began my career working at a school for kids with special needs and then transitioned to the public school system. I loved working in pediatrics! At my former parish in Ohio, we had started a ministry for individuals with special needs, teaching acceptance and inclusion; when we moved, I knew I wanted to continue to work in that capacity. It was absolutely perfect in my heart, where I could blend my



degree and faith to help children know the Lord.

I began working with the Special
Needs Faith formation here at Notre
Dame this past summer. We have six
children in our program, and we
meet monthly. We sing songs, learn
about God's love, and do some
community service. One of our
students, Maison, recently received a
special blessing for his First
Reconciliation; it was an absolutely
beautiful and moving service! While
the blessing of Reconciliation was for
Maison, we were all so blessed by
watching him peacefully receive this
sacrament.



I am so inspired by the children and their parents. This ministry is a great blessing to my family; my daughters often want to come and help! I truly believe that when Jesus said, "Let the children come to me," he meant all children! I am so happy with what the ministry has accomplished thus far and excited to see where it will be led in the future here at Notre Dame!

Congratulations, Chris & Pat Giro!



"Fr. Paddy sang a special poem during his homily."


